The Army Malaria Institute is a centre of excellence for studies in vector borne diseases with an international reputation primarily in the research of malaria and arboviruses.

A position for an Entomologist is now available at the Institute. The institute is located in Brisbane, Queensland. The position is for a research officer in the Royal Australian Army Medical Corps, Australian Regular Army, Australian Defence Force (ADF). This is a position for a career scientist and offers opportunities of professional and promotional advancement.

Duties: A detailed Duty statement is available on request. The incumbent will be responsible for conducting entomological research relevant to the Australian Defence Force. The primary role will be to conduct research into mosquito vectors of malaria and arboviruses. The position will involve overseas travel.

Eligibility/Other requirements: The position is for a research officer in the Australian Army, so the successful applicant will need to satisfy the mandatory requirements to become an officer in the Australian Defence Force (Army).

Minimum qualifications: A Bachelors degree in Science, preferably with a major in entomology.

Salary: The rate of pay will be dependant on qualifications and previous experience. The minimum rate of pay will be \$64,500 per annum.
